

Take notice that the following Ordinance was passed on first reading on the 15th Day of April, 1975, at a regular meeting of the Council of the Boro of Koppel.

It will be read for final adoption at the meeting of Council set for 8:00 P.M. on the 27th Day of May, 1975, at Boro Building, Koppel, Pennsylvania at which place all interested parties may be present and be heard.

BOROUGH OF KOPPEL  
PARKING ORDINANCE  
No. 362

WHEREAS the parking of tractor drawn trailer beds on Borough Streets constitutes a hazard to the public welfare in the following particulars:

By obstructing ready access to dwellings by fire fighting, police, or other emergency vehicles;

By obstructing the view of vehicle operators at or near intersections and in residential areas as to pedestrians;

By presenting an appearance inconsistent with the intent and purpose of residential zoning;

By risking damage to the roadbed by the dolly wheels of trailers when loaded and parked;

By occupying space intended for residential vehicle use;

1. NOW THEREFORE it is ordained and enacted that the parking of tractor drawn or other trailers, where the tractors have been detached therefrom, on the Streets, Avenues and Alleys of the Borough of Koppel is hereby declared to be unlawful and a summary offense, except under circumstances as enumerated below:

A. Where said parking has not continued for a period of one (1) hour.

B. Where said trailer has suffered an accidental mechanical breakdown or collision rendering it inoperable. In such cases the owner shall not be subject to prosecution hereunder for a period of two(2) days after such a breakdown occurs.

2. In no case shall a trailer be parked within fifty (50') feet of an intersection or in front of a residence other than that of the owner or operator.

3. Any person convicted of violation of any of the foregoing provisions shall be guilty of a Summary Offense and be subject to payment of a fine of up to \$300.00 or imprisonment for up to thirty (30) days or both.

4. This ordinance shall take effect on the first day of June 1975.
